Students will gain the knowledge and skills to administer first aid and carry out emergency procedures, including cardiopulmonary resuscitation, will avoid, recognize, and report verbal, physical, and emotional abuse situations, and will assess the factors that contribute to intentional and unintentional injury, including motor vehicle accidents,, fire safety, and weapons safety.	 Gr. K-5: Students will demonstrate an age appropriate understanding of the importance of fire safety, bus safety and personal safety by taking part in fire drills, bus drills, lock down drills and role playing personal safety situations. Students will demonstrate an age appropriate understanding of the emergency number 911 by role playing different situations where they would dial 911 and listing the times to use 911. Students will demonstrate an age appropriate understanding of personal responsibility for their actions by role-playing different situations and discussing what could happen with different decisions.
