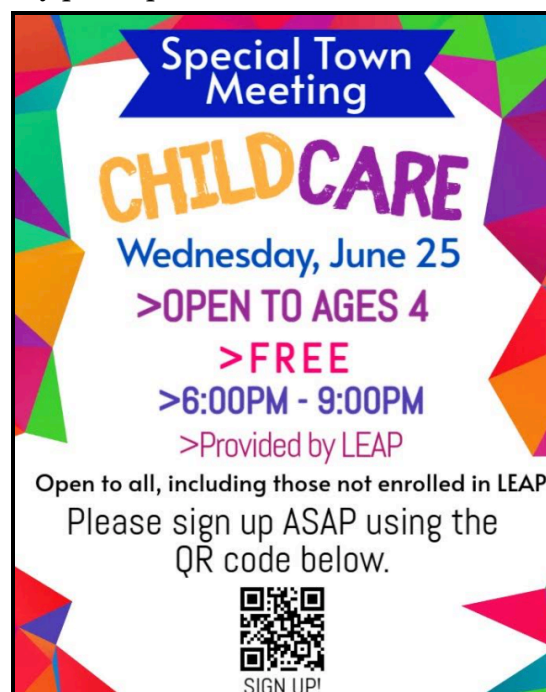

Opportunity from the State, due June 18

Ideas Sought for New State Seal, Flag Design, and Motto:

The Massachusetts Seal, Flag, and Motto Advisory Commission was established by [Chapter 140 of the Acts of 2024](#) to make recommendations for the adoption of a new design for the seal of the Commonwealth, a new design for the flag of the Commonwealth, and a new motto of the Commonwealth. To identify options for a new seal, flag, and motto, the Advisory Commission has launched a public process to solicit ideas from the general public – including students and individuals under age 18 – before issuing a public request for proposals for a professional designer to assist with the final design of the state emblems. The Advisory Commission will select three final options for a new seal, flag, and motto and will hold public hearings across the state to solicit public input. Following the selection of a final design for a new seal, flag, and motto, the Advisory Commission will submit its final recommendations to the governor. Teen Exec--a nonprofit founded and led by a Weston High School student--is offering two free summer workshop series in July for middle schoolers. These workshops focus on developing executive functioning skills like time management, organization, and goal-setting, and are designed to be engaging and age-appropriate.
