### Bottner, Barbara. Miss Brooks Loves Books! (and I don't) Humor, Picture Book A first-grade girl, who does not like to read, stubbornly resists her school librarian's efforts to convince her to love books until she finds one that might change her mind.

### Browne, Anthony. Me and You

This tale tells the Goldilocks story in a contemporary setting and presents the dual viewpoints of a girl and a bear.

### Charney, Steve. Easy Magic Tricks: Awesome Coin Tricks Magic, Nonfiction

This series shares step-by-step instructions and photos to describe how to perform simple magic tricks.

### Hills, Tad. How Rocket Learned to Read

A cheerful, little, yellow bird teaches Rocket the dog how to read by first introducing him to the alphabet.

### Ipcizade, Catherine. Big Mouths

Beautiful photographs and simple text describe animals with large mouths!

### Isaacz, Anne. Dust Devil

Having moved to Montana from Tennessee in the 1830s, fearless Angelica Longrider, also known as Swamp Angel, changes the state's landscape, tames a wild horse, and captures some desperadoes.

### Lewis, J. Patrick. Spot the Plot. A Riddle Book of Book Riddles

An illustrated collection of thirteen poems, each of which poses a riddle about a familiar story.

### Maccarone, Grace. Miss Lina's Ballerinas

Ballet instructor Miss Lina has a solution when her eight students, who always dance in pairs, are distraught when a ninth girl joins the class.

### Oppel, Kenneth. The King's Taster

The royal chef takes Max the dog, the royal taster, on several journeys to find a dish for the land's pickiest king.

# Osborne, Mary Pope. Magic Tree House: <u>A Crazy Day with Cobras</u> Fantasy, Chapter Book
