Dear Faculty and Staff,

The School Committee reviewed the results of a survey sent to Hanscom families, faculty, and staff about make-up days for this school year to accommodate the Hanscom Primary School move into the temporary facility. School Committee voted to revise the <u>Hanscom Campus</u> 2016-2017 Academic Year Calendar at the September 8, 2016 meeting.

The following changes were approved for the <u>Hanscom Campus only</u>:

- A half-day of school will be held on Wednesday, October 12 Yom Kippur.
- A half-day of school will be held on April 14 Good Friday.

These two days are the make-up days for two days later in the school year when students, staff, and HMS faculty will not attend school. But, HPS faculty, including preschool faculty, will pack and unpack to move into the temporary school. HPS and preschool faculty will be compensated for these two additional days.

At this time, we do not know when the move will take place. If it happens over the December recess, no school will be held on the Hanscom Campus on December 23, 2016 and January 3, 2017. These days would be used for packing and unpacking. Please remember that this is not definite, and therefore, you should not make plans for these dates until the move is confirmed. We should know if the move will happen over the December recess by November 10th. You will be updated as soon as we have additional information.

The Revised Hanscom Campus 2016-2017 Academic Year Calendar that was approved by School Committee follows on Page 2.


