During the months of October and November, the specialists collaborated on an interdisciplinary unit for the 4th grade about the planets. In music class, students listened to the composition "The Planets" by Gustav Holst and interpreted the intent of the composer. In library class, they conducted research on the different planets in our solar system and started the process of imagining their own, unique planets. In computer class, they used a word processing application to write a description of the planet. In art class, they created a 3-D model of their planet. And finally, in wellness class, they applied communication and cooperation skills with the aim to share materials and also to listen to peers' suggestions and be receptive to feedback, while making the 3-D model of the planet.
