(Standard 2) Writing narratives in which they recount two or more appropriately sequenced events, include some details regarding what happened, use temporal words to signal event order, and provide some sense of closure. (Standard 3) Write poems with rhyme and repetition. (Standard 3A) With guidance and support from adults, students will demonstrate an understanding of the writing process by: Focusing on a topic, responding to questions and suggestions from peers, and adding details to strengthen writing as needed.
