Strand: Speaking and Listening	 Discussions are an essential context for learning new concepts and ideas. Discussions make thinking public, allowing listeners to reflect on the thinking and problem solving process of others. Participants in discussions refine their thinking by expanding on the ideas of others, posing hypotheses, and working toward solutions to problems. Skilled presenters plan and deliver oral presentations by considering how to most effectively convey information to others in order to maintain an audience's interest, attention and respect. Through the study of English grammar and word usage, students gain more control over their speaking allowing them to deliver more precise messages.

	 respectful ways, listening to others with care, speaking one at a time about the topics and texts under discussion). (Standard 1b) Ask questions to check understanding of information presented, stay on topic, and link their comments to the remarks of others. (Standard 1c) Explain their own ideas and understanding in light of the discussion. (Standard 1d) Ask and answer questions about information from a speaker, offering appropriate elaboration and detail. (Standard 3) Create engaging audio recordings of stories or poems that demonstrate fluid reading at an understandable pace; add visual displays when appropriate to emphasize or enhance certain facts or details.
