

Who Do I Talk To If I...

Have an issue with what is being taught? Want to see the policy regarding X?

Worry that my child is being bullied? Hear a rumor that XXX?

Have a question about the school budget? Feel like nothing is being done to address a particular issue.

Want clarification on what topics/materials are being used in the classroom.

In most occasions, the teacher is the first person to start a discussion with. Open, honest communication is best for all involved. Email or call the teacher to let them know of your question or concern and set up a time to meet in person or talk over the phone. The teacher sees your child the most and will be the best source of information on what is happening in the classroom.

If your issue was not satisfied, the next step would be to talk with the principal, and then the Superintendent,. Reach out to the School Committee if you feel your concern has not been adequately addressed...


