LINCOLN SCHOOL COMMITTEE UPDATE

District Annual Goals

#1 Early Literacy

Using objective data and evidence-based instruction, focus on students falling behind in reading, so that at least 50% of K-2 students and 50% of grade 3-5 students identified as reading below benchmarks in the fall will read at or above benchmark by spring. Review literacy curriculum.

#2 Academic & Social/ Emotional Supports

Recommend improvements in social-emotional support systems PK-8 and academic interventions in grades 6-8. Specifically examine school-based supports for historically marginalized groups. Select mental health and risky behavior screeners and data collection.

#3 Student Conduct & Consistent Discipline

Ensure clear and consistent rules and responses around student discipline and code of conduct with explicit AIDE (anti-racism, inclusion, diversity, equity) perspective. Provide Responsive Classroom training for new faculty. This fall the <u>Lincoln School Committee</u> approved Superintendent Parry Graham's ambitious <u>District Improvement Plan</u>, including an accelerated K-8 literacy curriculum review. Assistant Superintendent Torrance Lewis and Curriculum Specialist Dr. Karyn Saxon (*pictured below*,) lead a team of 18 educators charged to research, pilot and recommend a new or much revised reading and writing curriculum by school year's end.

School Committee's Annual Goals:

- **Student Outcomes Reporting**: with administration, develop a standardized report and at least one SMART goal for student performance, prioritizing literacy and math metrics and guided by AIDE (anti-racism, inclusion, diversity, equity) values
- **Hanscom Contract Renewal**: Support administration to secure a renewed federal contract with the Department of Defense Education Activity to finance the District's stewardship of the Hanscom Schools. The current 5-yr contract expires July 1, 2025
- **Updated policies** and procedures to streamline meetings, match long-range agenda to budget calendars, and complete policy review with Mass Assoc School Committees
- Public Outreach: engage and inform the public regularly
