Approaches under consideration include:

- Adding Diwali, Eid al-Fitr, Eid al-Adha, and Lunar New Year as additional holidays.
- **Removing** Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, and Good Friday (note: LPS observes Good Friday as a half day, not a no-school day).
- Rotating a small number of non-state/federal holidays each year from a shared pool.
- Not changing which days of observance are no-school days.

Purpose

This survey is one of several ways our school committees are gathering feedback from staff, families, and community members. We are considering four approaches:

- 1. **Keep current non-state/federal closures** (Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, Good Friday).
- 2. **Add closures** for additional religious/cultural observances (e.g., Diwali, Eid al-Fitr, Eid al-Adha, and Lunar New Year).
- 3. Observe only state and federal holidays.
- 4. **Rotate** a small number of non-state/federal observances each year.

Your input will help balance equity, instructional continuity, and operational constraints.

Confidentiality & Reporting

Responses are **anonymous**. Results will be reported **in aggregate** (totals/percentages). We may share summaries by broad groups (e.g., Families, Staff, Community), and we will **suppress small subgroups** to protect privacy. Openended comments may be summarized or quoted **without attribution**; personal details will be removed.

Key Notes for All Respondents

- December 25 (Christmas Day) is a federal holiday; under a "state/federal only" calendar, school would be closed on this date.
- Current non-state/federal school closures are Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, and Good Friday.
- Diwali, Lunar New Year, Eid al-Fitr, and Eid al-Adha follow a lunar calendar and shift each year. If an observance falls on a weekend, the district would not close on the adjacent Friday or Monday; school would be in session on those weekdays. Because these dates rotate, an observance may occasionally occur during a week that already includes another non-instructional day.
- Accommodations (e.g., excused absences, flexible deadlines, avoiding major tests) are provided under the Accommodations for Religious and Cultural Observances Policy when school is in session on a major observance; other supports may be considered as appropriate.
- The district must meet a state-required minimum of 180 instructional days. Adding a closure for an additional observance will require adding a student day elsewhere (for example, extending the school year or adjusting an existing break)

2. Public Comment:

a. Safa Khan, Sudbury resident, representing the Muslim community. Ms. Khan shared knowledge on the timing of the Eid holidays and how they are calculated for future calendars. She also highlighted celebrating holidays is an opportunity for the community to come together in a positive way and to view the "no school day" as an opportunity for growth, not learning loss.

Matina Madrick, Lincoln Delegate, joined the meeting at 7:03pm.

3. Business and Policy

a. The Calendar Subcommittee agreed to screenshare the agenda packet so the public can follow along. The absentee data from peer Districts celebrating only State and Federal holidays was presented and the Subcommittee discussed the results and offered feedback.

- b. The Subcommittee reviewed and discussed feedback from Superintendents Crozier and Stephens. Superintendent Crozier defined impact bargaining and how it relates to contractual agreements. Other discussions surrounding afterschool care coverage, food contracts and potential additional costs such as substitute teachers and bussing contracts.
- c. The Subcommittee reviewed and discussed the compiled list of faith leaders and agreed upon specific leaders to coordinate a future meeting. The subcommittee discussed and agreed upon the format of the meetings and potential meeting dates.
- d. Member Simon opened the discussion regarding the staff and family survey and shared some peer District feedback. The Subcommittee discussed the pros and cons of surveys, reviewed recent surveys and reports from Wellesley and Acton Boxborough. Next steps in developing draft survey questions, timing of sending the surveys, when to review the results and bring it back to the individual School Committees and potentially extending the end date of the Subcommittee charge were discussed. The draft survey questions will be brought back for the next meeting.
- e. Rolling agenda, goals and future agenda items were reviewed and discussed. The timing of a potential full Tri-District meeting, receiving METCO feedback and the differences between a public hearing and listening session were also discussed.

1. Vice-Chair Lehroff opened the Calendar Review Subcommittee at 7:00 PM:

a. Roll Call Vote:

i. Ravi Simon Ayeii. Betsy Sues Ayeiii. Jacob Lehroff Ayeiv. Lucy Maulsby Aye

Vote: 4-0. Motion carries.

Due to technical difficulties, the meeting opened without video recording. The subcommittee took time to resolve the technical issues prior to opening up public comment at 7:13pm.

2. Public Comment:

- a. Manish Sharma, Sudbury resident, shared observations surrounding price gauging within restaurant industries and wanted to provide information in the event this topic is escalated to the FBI. Mr. Sharma also urged the three Districts to apply for grant funding citing each of the Districts have not received grant funding.
- b. Radha Gargeya, Sudbury resident and member of the Sudbury Select Board however speaking on his own personal behalf. Mr. Gargeya shared his background as a former Lincoln Sudbury School Committee member and the importance of making sure each student and staff member feel a sense of inclusion.

3. Business and Policy

- a. Vice-Chair Lehroff opened the staff and family survey discussion by discussing the goal of the survey and how they align with the subcommittees principles. He outlined data collection as the premise of the survey and the full subcommittee provided input into the type of data they would find most helpful to review.
- b. Discussions surrounding the goals ensued and each member provided feedback. Member Simon indicated in reviewing the questions it appeared members were not necessarily aligned in the information they were hoping to obtain from the survey. Further discussion and feedback around specific questions, introduction to the surveys and streamlining the questions in order to review data that may provide more insight into topics such as absentee data for current holidays celebrated by each District.
- c. The subcommittee discussed the purpose of the survey within the bigger process. Further discussion concerning the usefulness of the surveys, the data potentially not being representative of the community and the overall margin of error in the survey data being misleading was deliberated. The subcommittee agreed the questions should be deliberate, there needs to be an introduction to the survey so the community understands the impact of their answers and are making informed decisions.
- d. Other items discussed by the subcommittee encompassed accommodation policies, the need for potentially having someone with more experience in surveys review our questions to ensure it aligns with the data we would like to receive and analyze, ranking versus scaling questions, and keeping the survey limited to five to seven questions.
- e. Member Simon updated the subcommittee on scheduling the faith leaders for an upcoming meetings.
- h. Vice-Chair Lehroff reviewed the doodle poll and the subcommittee agreed on future meeting dates. The first meeting in September was scheduled for September 3, 2025. - i. The rolling agenda was reviewed and discussed. Mr. Simon gave an update on extending the timeline of the charge and coordinating a full Tri-District meeting potentially for November. The subcommittee will try and coordinate a listening session / public hearing for October.

1. Chair Burnard opened the Calendar Review Subcommittee at 7:03 PM:

a. Roll Call Vote:

2. Public Comment:

a. Dr. Shashi Dwarakanath, Andover resident, educating the subcommittee on Diwali. Dr. Dwarakanath provided three key points for Diwali: the preparation, the worship, and the celebration. She further outlined in detail the three key aspects of the holiday. Chair Burnard informed Dr. Dwarakanath her three minutes of public comment was up, however she is slated to present to the committee during the agenda topic.

Ken Lepage acknowledged his presence at 7:10pm.

 Akumayan Nafil, resident of Hanscom Air Force Base, noting he has two daughters and a wife and part of the Muslim community.

Lucy Maulsby acknowledged her presence at 7:13pm.

3. Business and Policy

- a. Dr. Shashi Dwarakanath, Dr. Abhaya Asthana, and Giri Bharathan Ji joined as panelists to the meeting to educate the subcommittee on Diwali.
 - i. Dr. Shashi Dwarakanath, a resident of Andover, opened the discussion by providing three key points for Diwali: the preparation, the worship, and the celebration. She further elaborated on the details of each aspect and noted that Diwali is the festival of lights and celebrated by Hindus, Jains, Sikhs, and some Buddhists. Among others, Diwali encompasses traditions such as fireworks, special foods, and lighting of the lamps. She noted the symbolism of the Diwali such as cleansing the home and oil baths and spoke to the holiday honoring the philosophy of life.
 - ii. Dr. Abhaya Asthana, a resident of Framingham and is the chairman of the new Hindu Center in Billerica, followed with educating the subcommittee indicating he grew up in the northern part of India. Dr. Dwarakanath shared her childhood experience of growing up in the southern part of India. He stated Deepavali, known as Diwali, translates to the "row of lights" and described in great detail the making and significance of a diya. He stated Diwali, for many, mark the beginning of the new year. He noted Diwali is a five day festival with the third day being the biggest celebration and stressed the importance of practicing and experiencing the spiritual tradition through prayer, reflection and celebration.
 - iii. Giri Bharathan Ji, a resident of North Billerica and a teacher of an ancient language, sanskrit and assisting with the Hindu Temple and Community Center in Billerica. Mr. Bharathan shared his experience growing up in southern India. He shared some common observances as well as some variations and the sense of belonging when students have the ability to celebrate without academic pressures.
 - iv. Questions and answers by the subcommittee included clarity around the five day celebration and which day students would celebrate and parents taking off the holiday should students have the day off. The subcommittee members expressed gratitude to the faith leaders for taking the time to join the meeting.
- b. Mahmood Al-Hafeed and Faiza Khan joined as panelists to educate and present to the subcommittee on Eid al-Fitr and Eid al-Adha religious holidays.
 - i. Mahmood Al-Hafeed, a resident of Weston and affiliated with the Islamic Center of Boston located in Wayland, started the discussion by outlining

the two major Eid holidays and their meaning. He described additional details of Eid al-Fitr stating it's a month long fast and practice of discipline. The holiday lasts three days and begins at the end of the fasting month. Eid al-Adha he described as a ten day ritual, a very humble experience, where everyone joins in the pilgrimage and rituals. He went on to inform the subcommittee that the Eid holidays follows a specific calendar and the date differs from year to year however it can be calculated well in advance.

- ii. Faiza Khan, a resident of Brookline and the president of the Islamic Center of Boston in Wayland, began her highlighting diversity, inclusion and the belonging of students. She noted Muslim students may feel "othered" because their holidays are not a day off and unable to share their cultural experiences with peers. Ms. Khan noted the academic, social, and athletic pressures of students when a holiday is not a day off. When describing the prayers, she stated most prayers begin in the morning from seven to eleven thirty. She spoke about the struggles of fasting while attending school and meeting academic demands. She acknowledged accommodations are difficult if school remains in session because engagement with the school falls on the family to ensure student success.
- iii. Questions concerning fasting for students and how it impacts their day at school were answered by the faith leaders.
- c. Vice-Chair Lehroff presented the draft survey family and staff survey. He opened the discussion by collectively capturing all of the input and considerations from the August 7, 2025 meeting. The draft survey was presented and initial feedback from members were given with continued emphasis that more feedback from an expert creating surveys would be beneficial. Dr. Stephens provided some administration feedback and member Sues shared a draft of edits during the meeting. Additional discussions surrounding adding information for a public hearing / listening session to the survey, gathering additional administrative feedback and soliciting an outside expert to review the survey was discussed. The subcommittee agreed upon next steps and the draft survey will be brought back for our next meeting on September 3, 2025. Superintendent Stephens left the meeting at 9:24pm.
- d. Member Simon gave a brief update to the Calendar Review Subcommittee after Lincoln-Sudbury met to discuss updating their religious accommodation. There was a brief discussion questioning if this was part of the Calendar Review Subcommittee charge or up to the individual School Committees to write their own policy.

- e. The subcommittee discussed the date of the public hearing / listening session. Concerns around the sensitive nature of the topic and allowing an open dialogue during a public hearing / listening ensued. The Subcommittee agreed to tentatively hold October 14, 2025 and bring back the discussion to finalize details.
- f. The rolling agenda was discussed and updated.

4. Adjournment
