Thank you to all who have already passed the Resolution. The broad-based support tells us that many of you understand it is our intent to mobilize a strong group of local and State officials, around the topic of adequate State funding for education.

Adequate funding for education is an equally relevant topic for both school and municipal officials from the largest cities to the smallest towns in the Commonwealth. The issue affects all types of communities - urban, suburban and rural in all corners of the state, from the Cape to the Berkshires.

The current formula needs updating. No matter what level of funding you currently receive, the underfunding of the Foundation Budget, as identified by the Foundation Budget Review Commission, affects all our schools and puts additional pressures on the property tax in all our communities.

The good news is that, acting together, we have become a meaningful voice in recent weeks.

4. Watch for more updates. We will be planning a meeting in early May to bring people together around advocating for this issue.

Lastly, we would urge all local officials to take the long view for this effort. One of the key pillars of the Massachusetts economy is an excellent public education system. When we eventually succeed in prioritizing state education funding in Massachusetts to a truly adequate, equitable and reliable level, we will all benefit and will have played a part in this laudable task.
