EDUCATIONAL PHILOSOPHY

The School Committee has the responsibility to ensure that there is a shared vision and strategy for education for the District. This vision and strategy shall be crafted, evolved and agreed collaboratively with the Administration and the School Committee, with input as appropriate from other parties including the wider community in Lincoln. This shall be described in a District Strategic Plan, which will represent the District's educational philosophy.

The Superintendent shall be responsible for the evolution and execution of the District Strategic Plan. In this regard, the Superintendent shall be responsible for defining the broad purposes of education and, through various means, for making these purposes known to all administrators, teachers, and other staff under their direction, as well as to the community. The Superindent shall additionally ensure that the Strategic plan is incorporated into yearly activities and budgeting as appropriate.
