

Summer Projects 2025 School Committee Update

September 2, 2025

Starting on the first day of summer and ending on the last, Lincoln faculty participated in 64 separate projects. 461 contracts were created totaling \$157,540, which were funded through a combination of the Title I, Title II, Title IV, FY24 and FY25 and operating budget. A handful of projects were campus-specific, with work happening in both the Lincoln and Hanscom schools Below are the projects completed throughout the summer:
