Goals of this new report

- Ensure that the School Committee and administration have a common, aligned understanding of how our most important resource, our staff, is allocated across the district
- Provide internal and external transparency for budget development and analysis purposes
- Create an added layer of internal and external accountability

Points of explanation

- Budgeted FTEs (which may include current vacancies)
- Assignment at school or district (or both)
- Class sizes based on October 1 data
- Middle school and essentialist assignments are more complicated to easily explain

High level takeaways

- LPS is generously staffed, with low class sizes and caseloads and high admin support
- Hanscom staffing is noticeably higher than Lincoln staffing
- We have limited flexibility with K-5 classroom staffing, but lower enrollment at Hanscom has led to some very small classes
- We are not fully utilizing the time our middle school and essentialist staff have available
- There would be value in creating internal metrics for us to better evaluate and compare the utilization of middle school and essentialist staffing

Introduction

This Staff Deployment and Class Size Report is intended to provide the School Committee and Lincoln community with detailed information about FY26 staffing allocations, student section assignments, and class sizes. When read in conjunction with FY26 and FY27 budget documents, this report will provide a more comprehensive and complementary picture of how Lincoln Public Schools makes use of its most important resource: its people.

Please note that all data are as of October 1, 2025, and that the data in the report represent a snapshot in time. Staff and student data in other reports may not exactly match this report as they may capture different report periods.

For ease of reading for the general public, here are a couple of points of explanation:

- "FTE" refers to "full-time-equivalent", which is the extent of personnel employment or assignment. For example, a 1.0 FTE means the equivalent of a full-time employee fully assigned to a specific job site. Partial FTEs may reflect the employment of part-time staff, or the allocation of costs and responsibilities across multiple job sites (for example, a 1.0 FTE employee may be split into two .5 assignments or budget allocations at the Lincoln and Hanscom Schools).
- Staff may be assigned to a specific school, or may be assigned to district-level responsibilities.
 It is possible for both to be true: one staff member may be partially school-based and partially district-based.
- Class sizes are based on October 1, 2025 enrollment data, and frequently shift over the course
 of the year as enrollment changes. That having been said, shifts in student enrollment are
 typically minor after October 1.
- Content area teachers in grades 6-8 typically teach multiple sections, and may teach multiple subject areas and multiple grades. To determine FTE assignments, a teacher's FTE is divided by the number of sections they are assigned, and then the FTEs are allocated accordingly. For example, a 1.0 FTE Social Studies teacher who teaches four total sections would have .25 of an FTE allocated for each individual section. Conversely, a 1.0 Science teacher who teaches five total sections would have .2 of an FTE allocated for each individual section.
- For ease of comparison, Essentialist/Specialist teachers (e.g., Art, Music) have information
 describing the total average number of meetings per week because they do not meet with the
 same section of students each day.
- All FTEs noted in the report are budgeted positions, not necessarily filled positions; in some cases, FTEs may be reported that are currently vacant.

All data is as of October 1, 2025, unless otherwise noted. Note: Data is not yet certified. Report will be updated when data is certified
