Subject: Agreement with METCO, Inc for Bus transportation

**Background.** The District has historically received bus services for the transport of our METCO students from METCO, Inc, who has competed the service s and entered into contracts on our behalf. The most recent agreement resulted from a competition in June 2006, covering the transportation services we received from Eastern Bus Company through the end of the past school year. METCO, Inc proposes to continue this relationship and contract on our behalf to provide services for the transportation of Lincoln School students from Boston. The proposed agreement would include pricing for three contract years of service (2011-2014) and for two options years (2014-2015 and 2015-2016).

**Discussion.** As part of the G4 discussions, the school business administrators for the Lincoln, Lincoln-Sudbury and Sudbury Schools agreed to align their bus contract expirations to provide for a consolidated procurement process. Earlier this year, we agreed that continuing the relationship with METCO, Inc for bus services for Boston students could provide value to the towns, so we directed METCO, Inc to include all three towns' requirements in a consolidated procurement.

METCO released a notice of bid on May 9, 2011 for bus services to transport Boston students for the towns of Lincoln, Lincoln-Sudbury, Sudbury, Lexington, Belmont and Foxborough. After several extensions, the bids were received and opened on May 31<sup>st</sup>. The apparent low bidder for our services was Vocell Bus Company, who was the target of a bid protest by another bidder. After review by the State Inspector General's office, the challenge was upheld and METCO was advised to rebid the contract for transportation services.

The package was readvertised on June 27, 2100, and the second round of bids were opened on July 19<sup>th</sup>. The bid results from the two responses for our requirements are:



No bid protests or challenges were filed, and METCO inc. is prepared to award a contract with Eastern Bus if the School Committee concurs with their recommendation.

**Conclusions & Recommendations.** The district has been pleased with the level of service and responsiveness of Eastern Bus during the past five years. Eastern Bus has provided good, timely service and is very responsive to comments and requests. Not only is the price proposed less than we paid last year, it is \$8,769.60 less than we had anticipated when we prepared the FY12 budget, reducing support required from other parts of the budget.

Accordingly, I recommend that the School Committee VOTE to enter into an agreement with METCO, Inc for the provision of bus services for transporting our students from Boston, and to concur in their award of a contract to Eastern Bus Company for services for the period 2011-2014.



## AGREEMENT

Whereas, METCO desires to provide the transportation services for transporting students from Boston to  $\angle \underline{M} \otimes \underline{M} \otimes$ 

Whereas, said COMMITTEE and METCO acknowledge that the total sum available for regular, late and special transportation hereunder is limited to the amount appropriated and allocated for transportation out of the funds appropriated for the METCO Program by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for each fiscal year 2012, 2013, 2014 and (the option) years 2015 and 2016.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed and understood as follows:

- METCO agrees to furnish transportation for certain pupils residing in the city of Boston, who attend public school in <u>Lew Mm</u>, for the period of August 25, 2011 through June 30, 2014. METCO also agrees to furnish the usual and necessary additional transportation customarily required for special purposes, insofar as funds therefore are available for after-school activities and parental visits. METCO'S determination of what additional transportation can be provided, within available funds, shall be conclusive.
- 2. METCO agrees to design routes, communicate same to parents of such students in a timely fashion, provide operational oversight of transport and liaison with bus operators, and perform such additional services as are reasonably required for full performance of the subcontract.
- 3. METCO agrees to draft specifications, receive bids in an appropriate manner for the purpose of awarding one or more contracts for transportation services, hereinafter collectively called the subcontract, and to award and administer such subcontract all in

accordance with the provisions and requirements of General Laws, Chapter 40, Section

4 and General Laws, Chapter 30 B, Chapter 71, Section 7A to the extent applicable, provided that all sums due from the COMMITTEE for such purposes are paid to METCO as described hereinafter.

- 4. METCO will pay all sums due the bus contractor under the subcontract. The COMMITTEE hereby agrees to pay METCO for such services as hereinafter described.
- 5. The COMMITTEE agrees that all funds designated "Transportation," which include regular, late, special trips (charter), and emergency transportation and such other agreed upon transportation, contained within its currently approved project grant under the COMMITTEE'S Program to Eliminate Racial Imbalance shall be paid directly to METCO on a quarterly basis, or such other basis not less than quarterly to coincide with the State Department of Education's schedule of payments to school districts participating in the Program to Eliminate Racial Imbalance. Said funds are subject to adjustment upon receipt of an invoice from METCO based on any extraordinary or increased costs, including all amounts paid by METCO under any fuel, insurance or other adjustment clause in the subcontract; PROVIDED HOWEVER, that the total obligations of the COMMITTEE hereunder shall not exceed the sum appropriated and allocated by the Commonwealth for the purposes of this agreement. Should unforeseen events or requirements necessitate additional funds for the purposes set forth in this Agreement, the COMMITTEE shall endeavor to obtain said funds from the Commonwealth. It is agreed further that the COMMITTEE shall not be liable for any amounts in excess of said appropriation, but that the COMMITTEE, at its option, may otherwise appropriate additional funds. In any case, should the COMMITTEE be unable to pay METCO any of such additional funds due hereunder, it shall so inform METCO as soon as possible, and in any event, ten (10) business days before the cessation of payments, and in writing, by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid and evidenced by a signed return receipt.
- 6. METCO shall maintain on its books a separate account for the purpose of receiving and disbursing all funds for the subcontract. Said account shall be entitled "Transportation - Town of <u>Lincerne</u>." METCO shall cause to be performed an independent annual audit of said funds hereunder and shall, within a reasonable period after the close of the school year, provide a copy of said audit to the COMMITTEE, which will list all payments made by METCO under the subcontract for the Town of <u>Lincerne</u>, and all of the payments and credits received by METCO as a result of furnishing such transportation. The COMMITTEE shall, within 21 business days after receiving said audit, reimburse METCO for any and all expenses incurred hereunder and not otherwise compensated for PROVIDED HOWEVER that the obligation shall be subject to the provisions of Section 5. In the event the total sums paid to METCO by the fiscal agent for the account of the

COMMITTEE hereunder exceed the payments made by METCO under the

subcontract for the Town of <u>Lin Optim</u>, METCO within 21 business days after rendering the accounting referred to above, shall reimburse the fiscal agent in full the amount of such unexpended sums.

- 7. All communications from the COMMITTEE, its agents and employees concerning the transportation provided for herein, including all requests for services, all requests for schedules and routes and changes of schedules and routes, and all complaints shall be made to METCO and not to the bus operator or bus drivers. METCO shall, in consultation with the Public Schools of <u>()</u>, <u>()</u>, establish all routes and schedules and shall have the sole power to make changes therein; PROVIDED HOWEVER that the COMMITTEE shall at all times have the sole authority to establish and change school opening and closing times and school schedules. The COMMITTEE shall designate a single employee, or at its option, a single employee for each school serviced under this contract, who shall be responsible for all communications with METCO regarding cancellation of school on any day not later than 6:00 A.M. on such day, as far as is practicable.
- 8. If the COMMITTEE employs a Bus Monitor for any elementary route, the COMMITTEE shall include in the job description and hold said bus monitor responsible for at least the following functions:
  - a. boarding the bus at or before the third scheduled stop in the morning.
  - b. on return trips, remaining on the bus until the same scheduled stop.
  - c. crossing streets with elementary school children.
  - d. maintaining order on the bus.
  - e. reporting incidents of disobedience by students to their Supervisor or the METCO Transportation Department. In the event of Monitor absence from the bus due to sickness, personal emergencies, or any other reason, the COMMITTEE or its employees shall notify METCO and shall attempt to find a temporary replacement for the monitor if such absence exceeds 24 hours. METCO shall have no responsibility for supervision of the Bus Monitor's execution of duties.
- 9. Should unforeseen events occur whereby METCO, Incorporated is unable to continue the management of the transportation services as listed in this agreement, the management of terms stated herein may be assigned to the school district as long as both the district and METCO, Incorporated assent to such undertaking in writing.
