Re: Student Feedback Survey Results

Date: March 11, 2015

In 2013 – 2014 the Lincoln Public School district participated in a pilot project, coordinated by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE), to develop a survey that would provide students with the ability to give feedback directly to their teachers about their experience in the classroom. Administrators and teachers provided feedback and input about the survey questions as well as the survey administration process. As a result of the pilot, DESE disseminated model surveys for students in grades 3-12 and determined that, at this time, a survey would not be used to gather feedback from students in grades K-2. The 2013 – 2014 survey results were not considered valid. The primary purpose of the pilot was to determine which survey questions proved to be statistically viable. In addition, the administration received district and school level data but did not receive individual teacher data. Individual teachers did receive their own results.

In 2014 - 2015, the Lincoln Public Schools again volunteered to work with DESE and the survey vendor, Panorama Education. Surveys were administered to all students in grades 3 - 8 in the month of February. We chose to administer the surveys in February in order to provide teachers with time during the school year to respond to the results with the students who had completed the surveys. Teachers received access to their survey results the first week of March.

To assist teachers with reviewing their results and considering how to reflect upon the results and respond to their students, the superintendent led a workshop on March 4th for teachers in grades 3-8 who received survey results. The superintendent also led a session with the Administrative Team on March 10th to ensure that teachers and administrators received a consistent message about how the surveys will be used. In addition, the Administrative Team reviewed the district level survey results.

During the School Committee meeting on March 19th, you will receive information about the administration of the Student Feedback Surveys. District and school level results will be presented. The reports provided by Panorama Education organize the results according to the Standards and Indicators on the Standards of Performance rubric used for educator evaluation. These reports will be shown digitally at the School Committee meeting. Included in this packet are the survey results re-organized by categories that more closely align with our Strategic Priorities. We will review and discuss the district level results at the March 19<sup>th</sup> School Committee meeting.
