- 4. Outdoor Adventure Details:
 - a. Information being provided is from last year's adventure. We will provide updated information when it becomes available.
 - b. Saturday, January 14th Sunday, January 15th (Martin Luther King Holiday Weekend). Our destination is the Highland Center in Crawford Notch, NH. The center is owned by the Appalachian Mountain Club (AMC) and the winter trip will be run by Lincoln School/YOP staff. We will depart from the school parking lot at 9:00am on Saturday, 1/14, and return on Sunday, 1/15 at 6pm.
- 5. For the January trip, transportation will be provided by Lincoln Staff, a 12 passenger van.
- 6. Overnight accommodations will be organized by Lincoln/ YOP staff. Boys and girls will sleep in separate sections of the Highland Center.

- 7. This outdoor adventure will cost \$100. Students in need of financial assistance will receive aid from the Legacy Fund.
- 8. Nine of the nineteen Outdoor Club members will participate in the trip along with three adults.
- 9. Steve Cullen and Jaime Moody will chaperone the trip along with a school approved nurse.
- 10. Information packet is included.
- 11. Medical care will be provided by the school approved nurse. All students are required to complete an AMC Permission/health forms packet along with Lincoln School Forms.
- 12. Permission slip is attached.
- 13. Parent outreach effort will take place at least 2 weeks prior to the trip. Date TBD.
- 14. Outdoor Club students who are interested in attending the trip will write an essay about why they should be selected to attend. Nine students will be selected.
- 15. Field trip forms are attached.


