Re: Report on Student Participation in Extracurricular Athletics, Music, Drama

Programs and other extracurricular activites

Date: October 31, 2019

This report will provide a description of each afterschool extracurricular offering in the areas of athletics, music and drama. Included is data regarding the number of students who participated and the accompanying demographic information for the 2018-2019 school year. Information on fees and scholarships are also included.

District-wide Athletic Participation

Below are the sports currently offered by campus and by season. It's important to note that cross-country is open to 5th graders on both campuses. All other sports are available for students in grades 6-8.

An analysis of the 2018-2019 student participation in athletics overall revealed the following information:

• There are 215 students participating in athletics in the district. Lincoln includes 110 students and Hanscom includes 105 students. This equals 46.4% of students in grades 5-8 population. In the past, the Hanscom Middle School did not have a girls soccer team and the Lincoln School only had one team

each for boys and girls basketball. There is now an A team and a B team for boys basketball and an A team and B team for girls basketball.

• Some Boston resident students are participating in athletics.

District-wide Music Lesson Participation

The Lincoln Public Schools supports students in learning to play an instrument by organizing instrumental music teachers to come to the schools at the end of the school day to provide lessons. Students may select from individual and group lessons. The goal of the After School Music Program is to enhance and expand the role music plays in the lives of our students.

An analysis of the 2018-2019 student participation in music overall revealed the following information:

- There were 161 students participating in afterschool music in the district. Some of these students take multiple instrumental instruction. Participation equals 13.8% of the total student population.
- There was representation from many racial groups in music at all grades.
- There was a higher percentage of students with disabilities participating in music lessons with less English Language Learners and Economically Disadvantaged students participating. There were no METCO student participating in music lessons last school year.

Bentley Service Learning Programs- Hanscom grades 3-8

The Bentley Service Learning Program provides various experiences to support student growth in areas such as financial literacy, math extension, and advisory. Over the last 4 years there has been strong participation ranging from 30-60 students per year.

Fees

Fees are charged for athletics for Lincoln students and music lessons for Hanscom and Lincoln students.

Athletic Fees

For each student on the Lincoln campus a fee of \$175 is charged to the family. On the Hanscom Campus the fees are covered through the contract with the Department of Defense Education Activity. Financial assistance is available to Lincoln families through a confidential application process and may result in a reduction or complete coverage of the fees. Eight Lincoln athletes benefitted from this opportunity.

Music Fees

Music fees are the same amount on both campuses. Families pay a \$35.00 registration fee for each child participating in the After School Music Program.

Private Lesson Fees are the following:

• 33 lessons @ 30 minutes is \$1006.50 (based on \$30.50 per lesson)

- 33 lessons @ 45 minutes is \$1485.00 (based on \$45.00 per lesson)
- 33 lessons @ 60 minutes is \$1963.50 (based on \$59.50 per lesson)

Students may also participate in beginner group lessons at no charge other than the cost of renting an instrument and the \$35.00 registration fee. Students who have already taken advantage of our beginner group lessons are expected to move on to private lessons after one year.

Drama Performance Fees

The Lincoln Public Schools does not collect participation fees for students to be part of the drama productions. Tickets are sold for the shows and these funds are used to offset the cost of production.
